Supervision requirements:

Activities Coordinator: This person is responsible for the implementation of the archery safety arrangements.

Person in Charge: A single instructor will be appointed in charge of all archery activity. This person will have overall responsibility.

Qualifications: All instructors will be at least qualified to the standards of the Community Sports Leaders' Award of the Grand National Archery

Ratios: The Instructor / participant ratios for archery must never exceed 1:12 1
